#### Luke 2:11-14

For there is born to you this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. And this *will* be the sign to you: You will find a Babe wrapped in swaddling cloths, lying in a manger." And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying:

" Glory to God in the highest, And on earth peace, goodwill toward men!"

As we prepare to welcome the prince of peace, are there things that we need to forgive or we need to be forgiven that weigh down our spirit in a season of joy? The Contemporary Discussion class just finished a book by Adam Hamilton about forgiveness, and a process was suggested that might be helpful. Hamilton referred to this process as RAP, Remember your short comings, Assume the best of the other person and Pray for them.

You are better able to let go of bitterness and anger, if you take a step back to see that you are not perfect. Flaws and all, you can still be assured that you remain a child of God. Allow yourself to embrace this season of joy. Allow yourself to open God's gift of peace.

When you encounter those who do or say hurtful things, rather than allow anger to take over, see if you can let it go. Assume the best of that other person who just might be worn out by the season or is having something else going on in their life that is the cause of the behavior. Our view can change if we take a step back and are able to see them as a child of God. It is amazing how much a smile or kind word can mean. It can bring us more of a sense of peace if we work to assume the best of those we encounter.

When you take a moment to pray for that other person, it might open up the possibility to feel compassion toward them. It frees you from carrying the bitterness and anger you were feeling. This might open you more to experiencing the peace and goodwill that is this time of year. This might make you ready to welcome the Prince of Peace with a heart that has plenty of room for him.

# From United Methodist Women To United Women in Faith



On March 2, 2022 United Methodist women became what is now the United Women in Faith. The move is part of a refreshing of the organization that includes a new logo and an array of new and improved programs to nurture current members and welcome new women to join, to put their love in action on behalf of women children and youth.

The changes are designed to address the different needs and life stages of current members and new women and expand options for membership and engagement. The new name also aims to welcome current members whose local churches may choose to disaffiliate from the United Methodist Church as well as women of other faith traditions who want to join.

New and innovative programs will be rolled out through 2022 including a new an easier way to navigate the website, a new "All-Access" National Membership, Soul Care Retreats, and Innovations to Mission (a multi-generational, Bible-focused curricula titled "Mission U" available for small groups, retreats, Vacation Bible School, and other settings).







There are a few Advent studies you can read on your own, an anthology of short Christmas readings, some novels that range from stories about pets to mysteries (like Baldacci's *The Christmas Train*), romance and general fiction

- 1. Jason F. Wright's *Christmas Jars*, a wonderful story that prompted the charitable phenomenon of giving away jars off money.
- 2. Patti Callahan's *Becoming Mrs. Lewis*, an historical fiction account of the correspondence and later courtship between C. S. Lewis and Joy Davidman.
- 3. Jennifer Chiaverini's *The Christmas Bells* a dual narrative, one set in Civil War America, when Longfellow wrote his famous poem "I Heard the Bells on Christmas Day" after experiencing great personal loss alternating with a contemporary narrative about a family with a father MIA overseas.
